



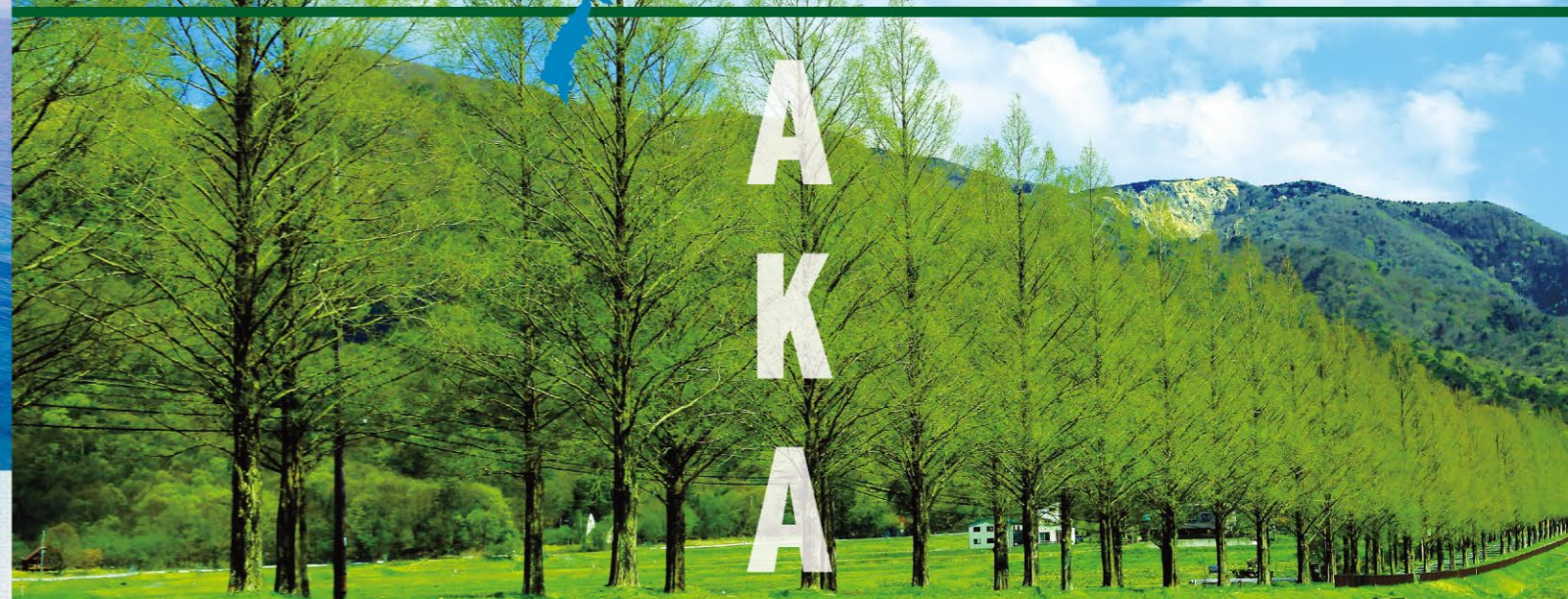
5 Shirahige-jinja Shrine (Japan Heritage)

The oldest shrine in Omi, famous for its great "torii" shrine gate that floats on Lake Biwa, the largest lake in Japan. A spectacular power spot where the god of longevity is enshrined and where there are many worshippers.

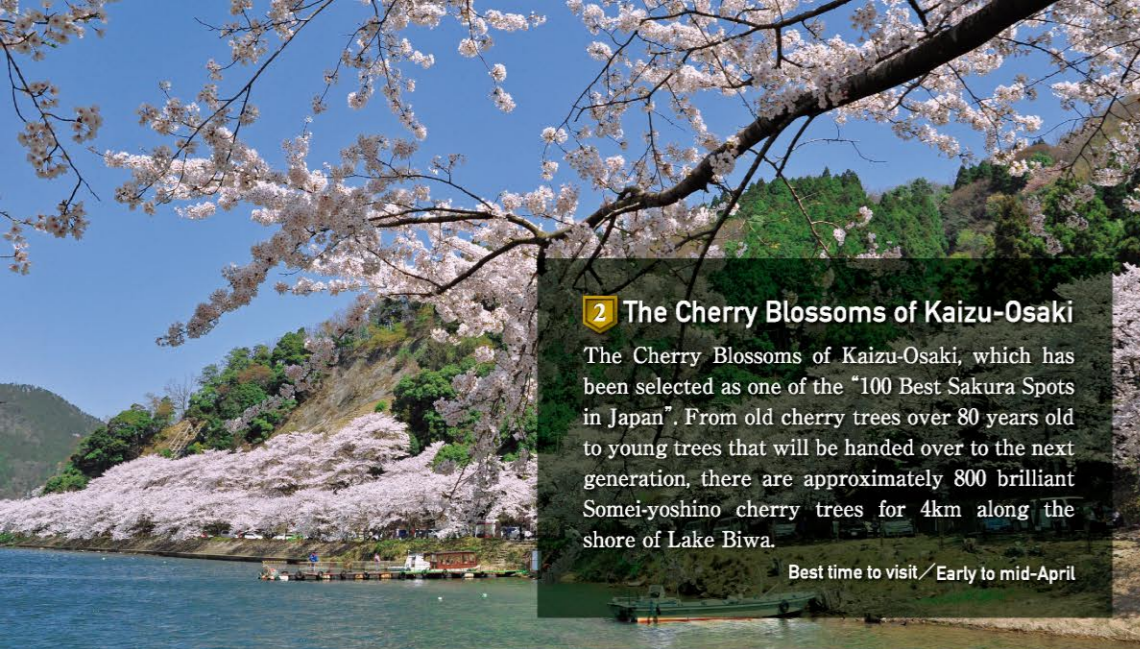
1 Avenue of Metasequoias

About 500 dawn redwoods are planted along the road that leads from Agricultural Park Makino Pickland to the Makino Highland over a length of 2.4km.

- Location / Makino Hiruguchi to Makino, Takashima City, Shiga Prefecture
- Access / Approx. 6 mins by bus from JR Makino Station

2 The Cherry Blossoms of Kaizu-Osaki

The Cherry Blossoms of Kaizu-Osaki, which has been selected as one of the "100 Best Sakura Spots in Japan". From old cherry trees over 80 years old to young trees that will be handed over to the next generation, there are approximately 800 brilliant Somei-yoshino cherry trees for 4km along the shore of Lake Biwa.

Best time to visit / Early to mid-April



3 Sea of clouds and autumn leaves of Onyu Valley

Located on the border between Shiga and Fukui Prefectures, the scenery seen from the Onyu Pass attracts visitors.

Best time to see / Sea of clouds from Oct. to Nov. (early morning) / Autumn leaves late Oct.



4 Hakodateyama Ski Resort

One of the best ski resorts in the Kansai region with an altitude of 690m. With an 8-seat gondola, you can quickly reach the slopes that have an established reputation for abundant snow volume and good snow quality!

There are three other ski resorts in Takashima City.

Regular business period / Mid-December to late March

Takashima canvas has a long history back to the Edo period. The high quality of the materials is nurtured by the climate of Lake Biwa and the reliable manufacturing method.



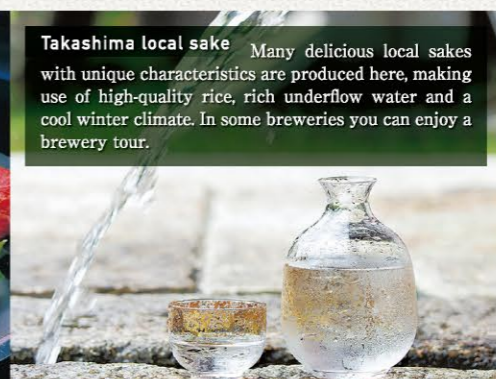
Wa Rosoku

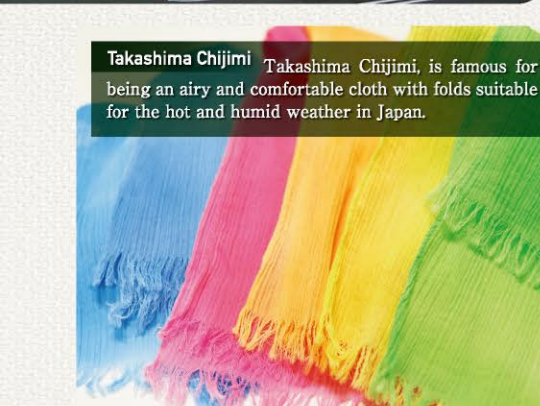
Takashima local sake

Takashima's various crafts and ingredients are sold at Takashima Marugoto Department Store.



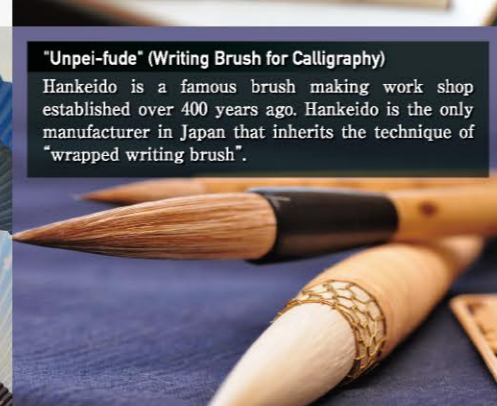
Takashima Chijimi

Takashima Chijimi, is famous for being an airy and comfortable cloth with folds suitable for the hot and humid weather in Japan.



The Omi Folding Fan

The Omi Folding Fan is made with Takashima fan ribs. Takashima boasts of a domestic share of fan ribs over 90%. The Omi Folding Fan is produced by many craftsmen.



"Unpei-fude" (Writing Brush for Calligraphy)

Hankeido is a famous brush making work shop established over 400 years ago. Hankeido is the only manufacturer in Japan that inherits the technique of "wrapped writing brush".



Takashima Tonchan (chicken)

The seasoned chicken sprinkled with homemade sauce is called "Tonchan" and has been loved as a familiar soul food locally. Today, it is a representative of Takashima's local gourmet food, and is an essential ingredient especially for BBQ.



Funa Zushi (Fish fermented with rice)

"Funazushi" (a kind of fermented sushi) is a famous preserved food of the area of Lake Biwa. It is made of a type of carp, a species native to Lake Biwa. It is popular as a food to accompany alcohol or Japanese tea.

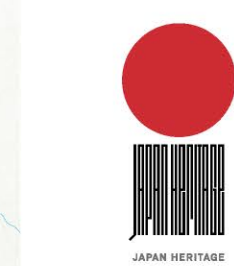


Ado Berry

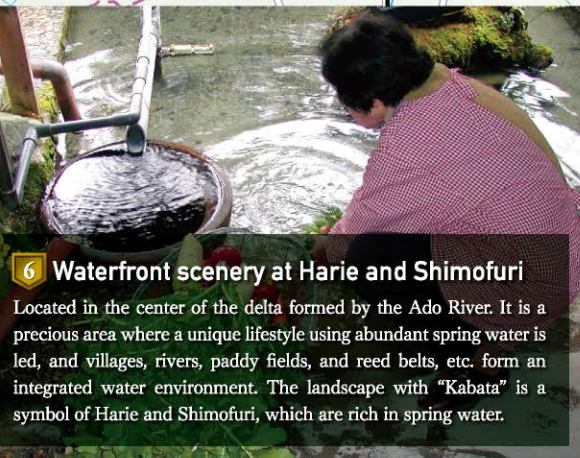

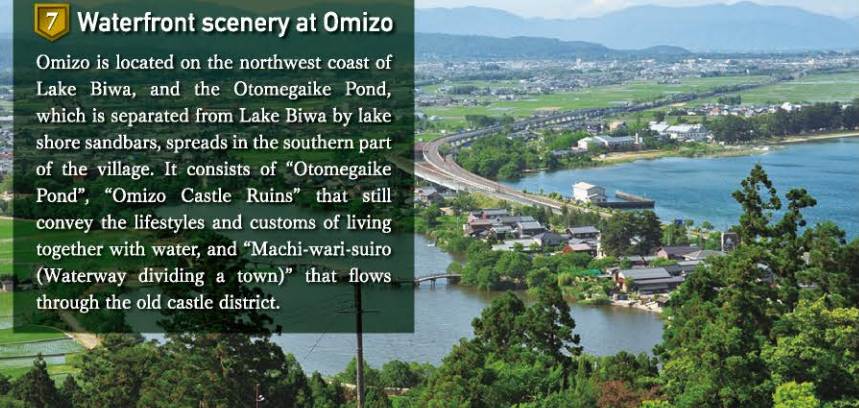
5 Shirahige-jinja Shrine Known for its vermilion "torii" shrine gate floating on Lake Biwa, it is also called "Itsukushima Shrine in Omi". It is said to have a history of about 2,000 years since its founding, and is famous as the oldest shrine in Omi. It is said that if you visit this shrine you can receive benefits such as, longevity, marriage, and conception.



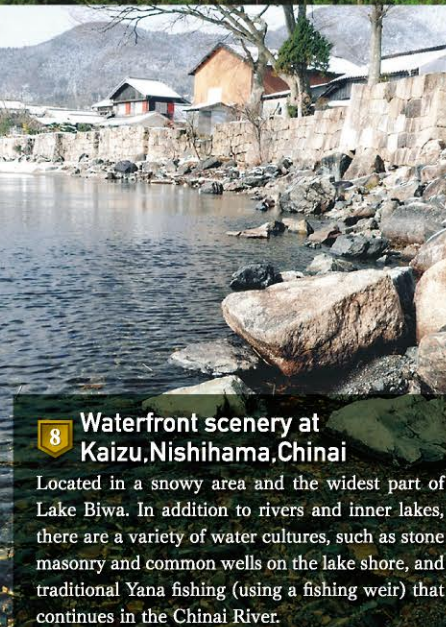
6 Waterfront scenery at Harie and Shimofuri Located in the center of the delta formed by the ADO River, it is a precious area where a unique lifestyle using abundant spring water is led, and villages, rivers, paddy fields, and red beets, etc. form an integrated water environment. The landscape with "Kabata" is a symbol of Harie and Shimofuri, which are rich in spring water.



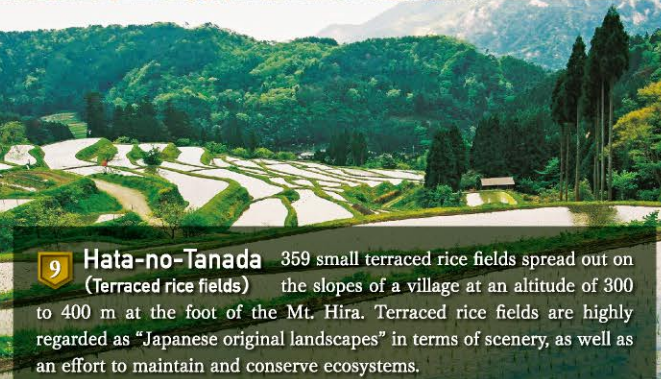
7 Waterfront scenery at Omizo Omizo is located on the northwest coast of Lake Biwa, and the Otomegaik Pond, which is separated from Lake Biwa by lake shore sandbars, spreads in the southern part of the village. It consists of "Otomegaik Pond", "Omizo Castle Ruins" that still convey the lifestyles and customs of living together with water, and "Machi-wari-suiro (Waterway dividing a town)" that flows through the old castle district.



8 Waterfront scenery at Kaizu, Nishihama, Chinai Located in a snowy area and the widest part of Lake Biwa. In addition to rivers and inner lakes, there are a variety of water cultures, such as stone masonry and common wells on the lake shore, and traditional Yana fishing (using a fishing weir) that continues in the Chinai River.



9 Hata-no-Tanada 359 small terraced rice fields spread out on the slopes of a village at an altitude of 300 to 400 m at the foot of the Mt. Hira. Terraced rice fields are highly regarded as "Japanese original landscapes" in terms of scenery, as well as an effort to maintain and conserve ecosystems.



10 Green Park Omoideenomori Kutsuki Onsen Tenku It originates in the legend of Tengu (long-nosed goblin), which was said to have run through the mountain fields of Kutsuki in the past. It is effective for neuralgia and fatigue recovery, and you can enjoy various hot springs such as Tengu's outdoor bath and a heated pool.
